

Sport Premium Report

From September 2013, all schools have been provided with funding to support the Olympic legacy and to enable the delivery of effective sports provision. Within the Diocese of Salisbury Academy Trust we aim to provide high quality sport. At Dunbury Academy, over a number of years we have provided the following:

- *opportunities to participate in multisports, football, netball, fencing, archery and swimming events and competitions*
- *opportunities to participate in a range of active after school and lunchtime clubs*
- *access to high quality coaching in a variety of sports from national and local specialist sports coaches*
- *continuing professional development for teachers to enable even better teaching of PE and sports*
- *provision of active learning outdoors, particularly at EYFS and KS1.*

Impact Report for 2020/2021

Our Sport Premium Funding for the 19/20 academic year was: £24200. Our plan detailed how we planned to use that money to maintain and improve provision. Due to the Coronavirus Pandemic the school closed on the 5th January 2021 to the vast majority of pupils, and reopened on the 8th March with social distancing and bubbles introduced.
