

Sport Premium Report

Since September 2013, all schools have been provided with funding to support the Olympic legacy and to enable the delivery of effective sports provision. Within the Diocese of Salisbury Academy Trust we aim to provide high quality sport. At Dunbury Academy, over a number of years we have provided the following:

- *opportunities to participate in multisports, football, netball, fencing, archery and swimming events and competitions*
- *opportunities to participate in a range of active after school and lunchtime clubs*
- *access to high quality coaching in a variety of sports from national and local specialist sports coaches*
- *continuing professional development for teachers to enable even better teaching of PE and sports*
- *provision of active learning outdoors, including forest schools, particularly at EYFS and KS1.*

Monitoring and Evaluation
